TruFund provides loans for contract lending, purchase order financing, business acquisition, equipment, expansion, and more.

WE Fund Crowd is a City-led crowdfunding initiative to help women entrepreneurs access affordable capital. In partnership with the crowdfunding platform Kiva, New York City women entrepreneurs can access to crowdfunded loans, of which NYC will contribute the first 10%. WE Fund Growth is helping women entrepreneurs grow their businesses with affordable, low-interest loans from local lending institutions.

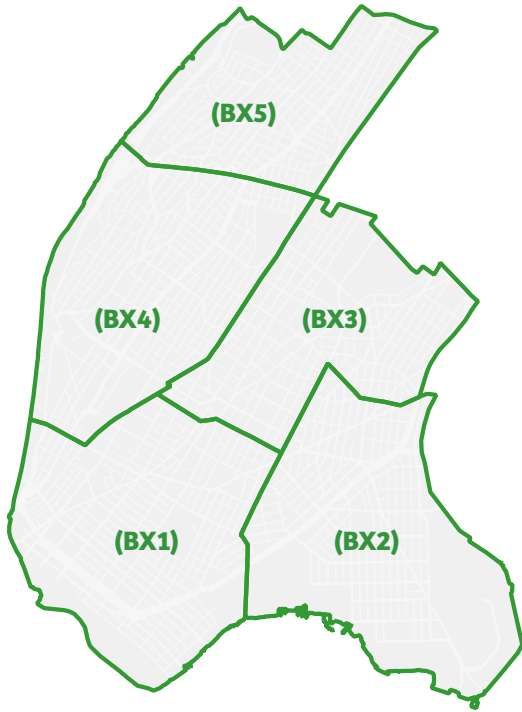
