FREE JOB TRAINING PROGRAMS

BCC Workforce Development and Continuing Education Low Cost Trainings

- OSHA 30 Hour Construction Outreach Training (ACE 5005): Learn all the safety rules and regulations governing modern residential and commercial buildings. Full attendance (30 classroom hours) is required to be eligible to earn the 30-hour OSHA Certification.
 - o 30 Hours: Tuition \$179
- Plumbing—Basics for the Home or Apartment Owner (ACE 5053): This
 introductory course is to help you learn basic plumbing maintenance tasks and
 handle common problems, such as leaky faucets and clogged drains. Students may
 practice soldering copper pipes or installing new faucets and toilets to improve the
 look and functionality of bathrooms and kitchens.
 - o 20 Hours: Tuition \$120
- **Food Handling and Safety Training (ACE 4004):** This training can lead to the NYC Health and Mental Hygiene Food Protection Certification. This certification is valuable for those who want to work in the food/restaurant industry, social service, and early childhood fields as well.
 - o 10 Hours: Non-Refundable Registration Fee \$20
- Customer Service Skills for Business: Good customer service isn't a gimmick, it's an attitude. Are you looking to improve your customer service skills, or are you an employer tired of the constant complaints and losing customers due to bad service? Are you looking for a job in the service industry and looking for a way to improve your interview skills? This course will teach you how to be goal-oriented, work within a team and take ownership and responsibility, as well as proper body language, tone and temper to be successful in the business community.
 - o 6 Hours: Tuition \$109
- Child Development Associate (ACE 3000): This course is designed for individuals who are eager to work with young chldrren in early childhood settings. The BCC Dept. of Education and Academic Literacy's Career Path Teaching Assistant Program in partnership with the Office of Workforce Development and Continuing Education offers the Child Development Associate Credential (CDA). The CDA credential is the most widely recognized credential in early childhood education. It sets forth a core of competency standards, which guides early professionals as they work toward becoming qualified teachers of young children. PArticipants are required to create a portfolio highlighting their 120 hours of coursework. Students that successfully complete the program may be eligible to earn credits towards the BCC degree in Early Childhood Education.
 - *Requires a High School Diploma or High School Equivalency (HSE)
 - 120 Hours of coursework in early childhood education + 480 observation hours in early childhood setting: Registration Fee \$150

The HOPE Program & Sustainable South Bronx

Building sustainable futures through comprehensive training, jobs, advancement and lifelong career support.

- **HOPEworks (class starting (6/13/2022, 6/20/2022)**: is a seven-week program that helps participants succeed in the job market and navigate careers in various fields through cover letter and resume writing, computer skills, interview prep, basic math and English literacy, and workplace soft skills such as public speaking and conflict resolution.
- Sustainable South Bronx (class starting Fall 2022): is a twelve-week program that prepares jobseekers for careers in the green infrastructure and maintenance field through classroom-based learning, industry-recognized certifications, hands-on community greening projects, and job application skills.
- NYC °CoolRoofs (class starting Summer 2022): CoolRoofs is a ten-week transitional employment program that pays participants to coat rooftops in a reflective material that reduces their energy output. Participants gain hands-on experience while making New York City more sustainable.
- **YouthBuild (class starting Fall 2022):** is a five-month international program model for jobseekers age 18-24 that provides essential skills training, High School Equivalency prep, and paid hands-on training in construction and other fields.
- **Intervine (class starting Fall 2022):** is a ten-week transitional employment program that pays participants to engage in hands-on learning through green infrastructure projects across the city while learning critical job skills.
- **HVAC (class starting 8/8/2022)**: is an eleven-week program preparing jobseekers for careers in high efficiency heating, ventilation, and air conditioning, with a focus on heat pumps and energy efficient technology.
