Preparing for Success in Kindergarten

Each year, 100% of four-year-old students graduate prepared for kindergarten, helping ensure that they begin their school careers ready to succeed.

Language & Literacy

- Children will engage in extended conversations with peers and adults
- English Language Learners (ELLs) will engage in conversations related to English language literacy activities
- Children will use a combination of drawing, writing and dictating to express ideas using a variety of methods
- Children will demonstrate knowledge of the alphabet by identifying and naming the letters within their own names

Physical Development & Health

- Children will develop fine motor skills by learning to manipulate every day tools, such as utensils and writing and art instruments
- Children will develop gross motor skills by participating in physical activities indoors, outdoors and at the fitness center
- Children will demonstrate knowledge of safe and healthy habits

Approaches to Learning

- Children will cooperate with peers to extend play and solve problems
- Children will demonstrate curiosity, creativity, flexibility, and a willingness to try new experiences
- Children will maintain focus to the successful conclusion of tasks either as individuals and in small and large groups

Social-Emotional Development

- Children will successfully navigate, establish and sustain positive relationships with peers and adults
- Children will demonstrate the ability to adjust to new situations

Cognition & General Knowledge

- Children will begin to acquire mathematical skills by learning to understand and intentionally manipulate quantities
- Children will demonstrate knowledge of simple patterns and sequences
- Children will demonstrate increasing curiosity of their natural and physical world, developing a foundation for scientific thinking
- Children will demonstrate an understanding of one's relationship to the family and the community
